## River Description:

Apparently this starts out with a couple of rock studded waterfalls at the highway. Nobody has ever been downstream to see what the rest looks like.

### How to get there:

<b>Put-in</b>	<b>Northing:</b> 5286592	<b>Easting:</b> 675730.4
From the road to Terrenceville turn right onto RD. 211 to Grand Pierre. The bridge over Terrenceville Brook is 2.1 km down the road.		
<b>Take-out</b>	<b>Northing:</b> 675017	<b>Easting:</b> 5284364
Your best bet is probably to continue down Terrenceville Brook until the road parallels the brook. This occurs at the end of a steady. It is probably shallow paddling and you might have to drag your boat, but I bet this is better than hiking through the woods up the side of a canyon.
